A judge in Britain has found the McDonald's Corporation "culpably responsible" for cruelty to animals. Before you bite, consider this:

- While alive, each McDonald's chicken is provided with less space than the size of this piece of paper. McDonald's buys eggs that come from hens who are crammed into small wire cages, stacked up in buildings with thousands of other birds. They are unable even to stretch a wing or to stand on solid ground.

- Chickens used by McDonald's are transported to slaughter in such an inhumane manner that almost one-third of laying hens suffer broken legs during the process. They are hung upside down and have their necks slit. Every year, millions of chickens are not adequately stunned and are slaughtered while fully conscious.

- McDonald's buys chickens genetically engineered to grow so quickly that many suffer painful leg deformities. "Broiler chickens" can be in chronic pain for much of their brief lives.

Other Animals Used by McDonald's Suffer, Too

- McDonald's uses breeding sows kept in such small stalls that they cannot turn around. For much of their lives, they are unable to engage in normal behavior, to feel the sun, or to breathe fresh air.
