animal experimenter	a person who tests on animals
animal pound	a place that houses stray animals
animal rights	the idea that nonhuman animals deserve equal consideration
campaign	a series of activities designed to bring about a particular result
charity	an organization that helps others for free
dissect	to cut up an animal for examination and study
documentary	a movie that presents actual events or facts about something
engineer	a person who has scientific training and who designs and builds complicated products, machines, systems, or structures
kennel	a large enclosure where companion animals are housed
laboratory	a place equipped to perform scientific experiments and tests
leprosy	a serious disease that causes painful, rough areas on the skin and badly damages the nerves and flesh
slaughterhouse	a place where animals are killed and their bodies are processed for food
spay/neuter	an operation that prevents an animal from having babies
steel-jaw trap	a device used for trapping animals that clamps down onto their legs or paws and cuts into their flesh as they struggle to get free
vegan	a person who does not eat or use animal-derived foods or materials
