

Video footage obtained by PETA has revealed that Texas A&M University experimenters have been intentionally breeding golden retrievers to develop canine muscular dystrophy. The dogs struggle to walk, eat, and even breathe.

• Bred to Suffer

The dogs in Texas A&M's laboratory are imprisoned in barren metal cages. They struggle to choke down thin gruel—all they can manage to swallow because of their weakened jaw muscles. Ropes of drool hang from their mouths.

• Destined to Die

Many of the dogs develop severe respiratory problems and congestive heart failure as their disease progresses. Most die or are killed before their second birthday.

Hoping for Change

Because experiments on animals aren't applicable to humans, decades of experiments on dogs have failed to lead to a cure or even a treatment for muscular dystrophy in humans. It's time for TAMU to switch to superior non-animal research methods to study this disease, including gene-editing technology and the use of cell cultures.
