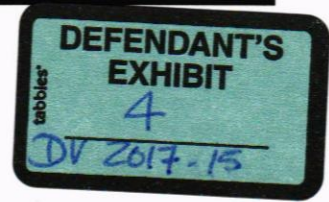

ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

The elephant's skin was noted to have thickened areas of dead skin present over her forehead and over her back area during this inspection. The licensee reports he is bathing her daily and is following his routine skin care regimen as set in place by his attending veterinarian. The presence of excessive accumulations of dead skin does not provide for the comfort, health and well being of the elephant. The licensee should have this elephant's skin care regimen and her skin health re-assessed by a veterinarian to evaluate the effectiveness of the current skin care regimen. Correct by 12/31/17.
