Each dealer or exhibitor shall establish and maintain programs of adequate veterinary care that include: (2) The use of appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases and injuries, and the availability of emergency, weekend, and holiday care;

\*\*\*Two female bison were observed with skin abrasions; some of these were healed or in the healing process and some were still open and red. These bison had previously been treated for lice, the last time being about July. It appears the treatment needs to be applied more frequently for these two animals to prevent them from causing wounds to their skin from licking/scratching. One of these bison was also thinner than normal. No fecal has been done in the last year for the bison as called for in the program of vet care. Need to consult veterinarian for treatment plan.

\*\*\*One dog has ocular discharge and crusting around both eyes. Need to have condition evaluated by veterinarian and treated. Correct by November 20, 2012.

All food receptacles shall be kept clean and sanitized at least once every 2 weeks.

\*\*\*Metal feeders for five rabbits were rusty. Rusty metal is not sanitzable and needs to be replaced. Correct by November 30, 2012.

WATERING.

All watering receptacles shall be sanitized when dirty: Provided, however, That such receptacles shall be sanitized at least once every 2 weeks

\*\*\*Metal cans used for waterers for five rabbits are rusty. Rusty containers cannot be properly sanitized. Need to replace rusty water cans. Correct by November 30, 2012.

#### SANITATION.

Sanitization of primary enclosures. (1) Primary enclosures for rabbits shall be sanitized at least once every 30 days.

\*\*\*Suspended wire cages for five rabbits had areas of rust and some hair and old excreta at edges and under feeder indicating they had not been sanitized recently. Need to thoroughly sanitize rabbit cages at least every 30 days and remove cages that are rusty since they cannot be properly sanitized. Correct by November 30, 2012.

## FACILITIES, GENERAL.

Structural strength. The facility must be constructed of such material and of such strength as appropriate for the animals involved. The indoor and outdoor housing facilities shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and to contain the animals.

\*\*\*The wooden shelter for the desert sheep next to parking lot has some broken boards at right front corner and some loose boards with protruding nails laying on ground in the back. Need to keep shelter in good repair to prevent injury of animals. Correct by December 1, 2012.

### WATERING.

All water receptacles shall be kept clean and sanitary.

\*\*\*Water bowl for one potbellied pig was dirty and needs to be cleaned. Correct by November 18, 2012.

### SANITATION.

Housekeeping. Premises (buildings and grounds) shall be kept clean and in good repair in order to protect the animals from injury and to facilitate the prescribed husbandry practices set forth in this subpart. Accumulations of trash shall be placed in designated areas and cleared as necessary to protect the health of the animals.

\*\*\*There was a metal pan inside the entrance to the potbellied pig stall that had a jagged metal edge that could cause injury. There was also a rusty metal pan outside that needs to be removed. Correct by November 18, 2012.
