Facilities, general.

One adult male Wallaby named "Ben" had died after closing on 9/16/2020. The morning of 9/17/2020 the Bird and Reptile Manager found the wallaby had fallen into the aquarium at the back of the enclosure and drowned. Inspector was told by the Support Manager that the wallabies are allowed access to the water in the aquarium. Along the left side of the aquarium is a concrete structure with stairs leading up to the top of the aquarium, that allows them access to the water. The evening of 9/16/2020, construction work was being done on the floors. Support Manager told the inspector that the noise may have frightened the wallaby causing it to jump into the water. The aquarium had no climbing structures on the inside to assist the animal to safely climb out of the water. The facility has implemented new procedures since the incident. Before staff leaves for the day a rubber platform is attached to the aquarium and netting is placed over the top. Facilities that are not constructed with material appropriate to the animals can lead to injuries or death. Housing facilities must be constructed of such material and such strength as appropriate for the animals involved and shall be structurally sound and maintained in good repair to protect the animals.

>>>> In the food preparation area is an open bag of Timothy Biscuits that is being fed to the two guinea pigs. Open bags

of food can deteriorate and/or become contaminated by vermin.

These items are stored in a manner that does not protect from deterioration, molding and/or contamination. Ensure that

all supplies of food and bedding are stored in the facility to adequately protects against deterioration, molding or

contamination.
