Dear Mr. Keka:

Thank you in advance for your time. We're writing on behalf of People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA) U.S.—the world's largest animal rights organization, with more than 6.5 million members and supporters—and its partner organization PETA Switzerland, regarding the upcoming Swiss-backed launch by your Congolese enterprise, Développement Tous Azimuts (DTA), of Troposphere 6, which Prime Minister Jean-Michel Lukonde has reportedly pledged to attend. We understand that this shuttle will apparently attempt to go into space, send a satellite to an altitude of 200 kilometers, and carry on board a guinea pig named Galaxionaut, who will parachute back to Earth.

Based on the information below, we urge you to prohibit the use of animals in experiments and transfer Galaxionaut to an approved animal sanctuary to live in peace, instead of being forced to endure a terrifying space flight. If you're willing to do this, we would gladly award you internationally for being part of the human space race.

PETA has already persuaded the U.S. National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) not to <u>support</u> or <u>conduct</u> horrific space experiments on monkeys, and <u>the European Space Agency</u> <u>also rejects monkey experiments for these purposes</u>. It has been scientifically proved that <u>animals are capable of feeling pain and fear</u>—similar to humans—so it's imperative to consider their interests and not inflict suffering on them. The <u>loss of the rat named Kavira</u>, who was aboard your company's Troposphere 5 shuttle that crashed in 2009, shows that animals sometimes even die because of these experiments.

The <u>case against sending animals into space</u> is clear, and modern, animal-free methods can actually produce human-relevant results.
