#### MISCELLANEOUS.

- (f) Handling. (1) Handling of all animals shall be done as expeditiously and carefully as possible in a manner that does not cause trauma, overheating, excessive cooling, behavioral stress, physical harm, or unnecessary discomfort.
- \*\*\*On June 18, 2012, one rhesus macaque was returned to the incorrect compound after observation and treatment at the clinic. This resulted in the death of the animal. Review of the incident by the adverse animal incident committee found the cause to be employee error. As a result the SOP for returning animals to there home enclosures was updated and employees required to review the amended SOP. Corrected.

### CLEANING, SANITIZATION, HOUSEKEEPING, AND PEST CONTROL.

- (c) Housekeeping for premises. Premises where housing facilities are located, including buildings and surrounding grounds, must be kept clean and in good repair in order to protect the nonhuman primates from injury, to facilitate the husbandry practices required in this subpart, and to reduce or eliminate breeding and living areas for rodents, pests, and vermin. Premises must be kept free of accumulations of trash, junk, waste, and discarded matter. Weeds, grass, and bushes must be controlled so as to facilitate cleaning of the premises and pest control.
- \*\*\* In M7 there are dead roaches too numerous to count in the light shields over the enclosures. In addition, the vent covers or filters have not been cleaned and have been covered with dust or debris and a mud wasp nest is on one of the vents. These items shall be properly cleaned and maintained on a schedule that will prevent accumulations. Correct by August 2, 2012

## Inspection Report

\*\*\*I observed an excess amount of rat droppings on the floor in building M1B. The current pest control program does not appear to be effective to prevent the presence of unwanted pests. An effective program to control the presence of unwanted pests must be established to reduce contamination and promote the health and well-being of the animals. Correct by August 19, 2012.

\*\*\*There were live roaches in the dry storage cabinet in the kitchen. The presence of roaches increases the risk of contamination of the food. All food shall be protected from contamination and an effective means of pest control shall be implemented. Correct by July 30, 2012.
