

In a government laboratory at the National Institutes of Health (NIH) in Bethesda, Maryland, Nick Nack, a 14-year-old rhesus macaque, sits inside a cold metal cage. He bears the scars—visible and invisible—of more than a decade of trauma. His fur is patchy where he has torn it out again and again. A thick titanium post is cemented to his skull. Parts of his brain have been destroyed by toxic chemical injections. Nick Nack has been caged all alone for most of his life, deprived of everything that's natural and important to him.

These experiments have raked in over \$50 million in taxpayer funds, but not one treatment or cure for humans has come out of them.
