

Snatched from their homes. Sick. Shoved into planes. Suffering in labs.

Canadian officials are ignoring serious allegations of illegal monkey trafficking and are allowing hundreds of endangered monkeys to be imported from Cambodia for cruel experimentation.<sup>1,2</sup>

In this dangerous and increasingly illegal trade, stressed monkeys who were captured in nature or bred in filthy, crowded facilities are exposed to diseases they then bring with them to Montréal.<sup>3</sup>

Tell Canadian agencies to end all importation of monkeys for experiments in order to stop the violence, safeguard monkey populations in nature, and protect public health.<sup>4</sup>
