Dear Dr. Rao,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your August 5, 2019 letter reporting a serious deviation from the provisions of the *Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals* at Virginia Commonwealth University, following up on an initial telephone report on July 18, 2019. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that two mice died and two were lethargic due to not receiving water. The investigator had brought the cage to the laboratory for training but forgot to return it to the vivarium.

The corrective actions consisted of euthanizing the two surviving mice and counseling the investigator and staff to never leave animals in the laboratory without food or water and to return cages to the vivarium on the same day.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and to reduce the likelihood of a recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy.

Virginia Commonwealth University, in accordance with Assurance D16-00180 (A3281-01) and PHS Policy IV.F.3., provides this report of noncompliance regarding lack of water resulting in the deaths of two mice plus two mice that were subsequently euthanized. This incident was reported to you on July 18, 2019 via telephone call by Ms. Amy Chuang, Director of Animal Care and Use Program, Office of Research and Innovation.

Description of Incident:

On Monday, July 1st the Division of Animal Resources (DAR) animal caretaker reported that the investigative staff brought a cage back to the vivarium containing two dead mice and two lethargic mice. The water bottle was empty. After discussing with the investigative staff, the remaining two mice were euthanized. The investigator was contacted and she admitted that it was her mistake. She brought the cage of mice to the lab for technique practice on Friday, June 26th but failed to return the cage to the vivarium on the same day before she left the lab, resulting in the deaths of the animals.

Corrective action plan:

- (1) The investigator involved in this incident has been counseled to ensure animals must not be left in the lab without appropriate food and water. Documentation of this counseling was recorded and maintained in the compliance folder.
- (2) The investigator has talked to her staff to ensure cages containing animals are brought back to the animal vivarium on the same day before leaving the lab.

We regret that this incident occurred. Following our detailed investigation, we have deployed specific corrective actions to enhance our program and to minimize future occurrences. The IACUC will be advised of the above corrective actions at their next full committee meeting.


