Facilities, general.

***Approximately forty percent of the sugar glider enclosures have severe rust and/or corrosion. The condition of the surfaces of the enclosures is inhibiting the enclosures from adequate cleaning and sanitation. There is a sticky layer accumulating on the wires and joints in the rusty areas. Improper maintenance of the enclosures may increase risk of disease hazards, weakening of the structural strength of the enclosure and and contamination.

The enclosures shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and to contain the animals.

Sanitation.

***The sugar glider room has not been thoroughly cleaned resulting in an excessive accumulation of waste material on the cage racks and floor. The room has a strong smell of ammonia and waste. The walls behind the cages and window sills have waste material splashed and dried on them and it has also accumulated on the base of the hanging water bottles. Accumulations of waste material can lead to increased presence of insects and vermin which may cause contamination of feed, discomfort and illness.

The room shall be cleaned and maintained in a manner to facilitate proper husbandry practices to provide for the health and well-being of the sugar gliders.

3.131(d) Repeat

Sanitation.

***There is a large amount of flying insects present in the sugar glider room. There are 14 fly strips hung throughout the room and all of the strips are full. During the inspection the inspector was continually swiping at gnats while speaking. Exposing the sugar gliders to excess flying insects may cause distress and contamination of food and illness.

A safe and effective program for the control of insects and ectoparasites shall be established and maintained to provide for the health and well-being of the sugar gliders

Facilities, indoor.

There is a very strong odor in the housing room for the sugar gliders. There is very little ventilation or fresh air currently provided leaving a strong odor of ammonia, scent marking, and other waste material. Heavy concentrations of ammonia like odors can lead to respiratory illness, attract flies and vermin. The room shall be provided additional ventilation to protect the sugar gliders from disease hazards. Correct by May 27, 2022.

Sanitation.

There are several cages that have become rusty allowing waste material to collect on the enclosure wires. The enclosures shall be cleaned in a manner that prevents such build up, reducing the odors and insect attractant to provide

FACILITIES, INDOOR.

The inspector smelled a strong odor when entering the indoor building that houses the sugar gliders. The inspector noted that several fans were running however the fans were not able to adequately provide enough fresh air to reduce odors. At the time of the inspection the cooling system had a mechanical failure and was in the process of being repaired. Excess odors could cause discomfort and health problems for the sugar gliders. Facilities shall provide adequate ventilation for the health of the animals and to prevent discomfort in the animals. Adequate ventilation is required to eliminate strong odors.

SANITATION.

There were four primary enclosures for the sugar gliders that had a brown sticky looking substance on the black wires of the cages. The four larger primary enclosures that house several sugar gliders should be cleaned more often to adequately maintain cages and reduce odors. This could cause disease and unhealthy living conditions for the sugar gliders. Excreta shall be removed as often as necessary to prevent contamination of the animals contained therein and to minimize disease hazards and to reduce odors. All primary enclosures for the sugar gliders need to be cleaned and maintained as often as needed in order to create an adequate healthy living environment for the sugar gliders.

FACILITIES, GENERAL.

Several of the black metal wire sugar glider enclosures have a brown sticky substance on the wires which may affect the structural integrity of the primary enclosures for the sugar gliders. The primary enclosures could be rusty under the brown sticky substance however due to lack of cleanliness it was difficult to determine. The primary enclosures shall be kept clean in order to prevent corrosion and deterioration of the primary enclosures. The indoor housing facilities shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair in order to protect the sugar gliders from injury. The primary enclosures need to be cleaned to determine if they are structurally sound.

FACILITIES, INDOOR.

The odor in the sugar glider indoor building facility was so strong and pungent that the inspector acquired a headache during the inspection. The inspector noted that the ventilation equipment was turned off at the time of the inspection. Since the primary enclosures were not clean, the odor could be a combination of feces, urine, deteriorated food and soiled bedding/litter or inadequate fresh air or inadequate ventilation equipment. If the inspector was unable to tolerate conditions in the indoor building these conditions could cause discomfort and health problems for the sugar gliders. Facilities shall provide adequate ventilation for the health of the animals and to prevent discomfort in the animals. Adequate ventilation is required to eliminate strong odors. Correct by 11/28/2015.

SPACE REQUIREMENTS.

The inspector noted that many of the sugar gliders have a lack of adequate nesting/hiding spots available in the primary enclosures. Many of the sugar gliders have plastic drinking cups for nesting/hiding areas which are cracked /broken and have inadequate or no available areas for nesting/hiding. The inspector also noted that sugar gliders were hiding/nesting in any available space including feeding receptacles. The sugar gliders were noted to be very active in daylight hours which is an abnormal behavior pattern for a nocturnal species. It is important to have adequate hiding/nesting space available in order for the sugar gliders to maintain a normal nocturnal behavior pattern. Enclosures shall be constructed and maintained so as to provide normal postural and social adjustments.

FEEDING.

Many of the food receptacles in the primary enclosures have a brown/black substance on the outside of the receptacles. Some sugar gliders were using the food receptacles as a bed/resting/hiding spot which could cause food contamination. Some of the food receptacles were cracked or broken which could cause injury to the sugar gliders while eating or contamination of their food. Food receptacles shall be kept clean at all times. Replace or clean. Correct by 11/30/2015.

SANITATION.

The primary enclosures for the sugar gliders were caked with a brown sticky looking substance on the black wires of the cages. The floors had food,fruit flies, feces and litter that was not clean in the cages. The odor coming from the cages was very strong smelling. This could cause disease and unhealthy living conditions for the sugar gliders. Excreta shall be removed as often as necessary to prevent contamination of the animals contained therein and to minimize disease hazards and to reduce odors. All primary enclosures for the sugar gliders need to be cleaned and maintained as often as needed in order to create an adequate healthy living environment for the sugar gliders. Correct from this day forward.

SANITATION.

There are several jars in the interior window sills with a liquid inside the jar for capturing fruit flies . The jars are full of fruit flies and look untouched or recently replenished with different liquid. Also fly strips are hanging from the ceiling and are full of fruit flies. The jars and fly strips are either full or inadequate to continue being of any substantial use in capturing fruit flies. Clean all unused jars and fly strips that are inadequate or ineffective. Buildings shall be kept clean and in good repair to protect animals from injury. Correct by 11/26/2015

SANITATION.

The sugar glider primary enclosures have fruit flies accumulating in the black wire cages due to food and litter contamination in the enclosures. There were fruit flies flying around the sugar glider cages and thru out the indoor building housing the sugar gliders. One of the sugar gliders jumped and a cloud of fruit flies was visible in the enclosure. The fruit flies are in great abundance and due to the rapid ability to reproduce need to be controlled and eliminated. Insects may cause disease and may contaminate food in the sugar glider cages. EMPLOYEES.

At this time only one owner is available to maintain approximately 150 sugar gliders. The one person is responsible for all the care of the sugar gliders including cleaning all enclosures, all feeders ,feeding all food, pest control, maintain building, changing all litter/bedding, and replacing all items needed for enclosures. The person also takes sugar gliders to the flea market every weekend to sell the sugar gliders. A sufficient number of adequately trained employees shall be utilized to maintain the professionally acceptable level of husbandry practices. An adequate number of employees is needed to assure proper care of all the sugar gliders. Correct by 11/30/2015.
