<u>CITATION AND NOTIFICATION OF PENALTY</u>

We believe that you violated the Animal Welfare Act (7 U.S.C. § 2131 et seq.) (AWA), as described below.

Date of Alleged Violation: On or about November 18, and December 18, 2018y 21, 2019

9 C.F.R. § 2.38(f)(1) Handling. Handling of all animals shall be done as expeditiously and carefully as possible in a manner that does not cause trauma, overheating, excessive cooling, behavioral stress, physical harm, or unnecessary discomfort.

You failed to properly handle an animal at your facility to not cause trauma, overheating, excessive cooling, behavioral stress, physical harm or unnecessary discomfort.

Identified during the May 21, 2019 inspection, there were two incidents of non-reparable orthopedic injuries to non-human primates were identified and attributed to improper handling procedures being a factor in causing the injuries.

Date of Alleged Violation: On or about March 18, 2020

9 C.F.R. § 2.38(f)(1) Handling. Handling of all animals shall be done as expeditiously and carefully as possible in a manner that does not cause trauma, overheating, excessive cooling, behavioral stress, physical harm, or unnecessary discomfort.

You failed to properly handle an animal at your facility to not cause trauma, overheating, excessive cooling, behavioral stress, physical harm or unnecessary discomfort.

Identified during the July 19, 2021 inspection, a male macaque suffered a femur fracture attributed to improper handling. The animal was humanely euthanized.

Date of Alleged Violation: September 23, 2021

9 C.F.R. § 2.38(f)(1) Handling. Handling of all animals shall be done as expeditiously and carefully as possible in a manner that does not cause trauma,

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overheating, excessive cooling, behavioral stress, physical harm, or unnecessary discomfort.

You failed to properly handle an animal at your facility to not cause trauma, overheating, excessive cooling, behavioral stress, physical harm or unnecessary discomfort.

Identified during the November 19, 2021 inspection, a male macaque sustained a right arm fracture while being handled for observations and weighing. An improper step in handling was found to be the cause of the incident.

Date of Alleged Violation: December 1, 2021

9 C.F.R. § 2.38(f)(1) Handling. Handling of all animals shall be done as expeditiously and carefully as possible in a manner that does not cause trauma, overheating, excessive cooling, behavioral stress, physical harm, or unnecessary discomfort.

You failed to properly handle an animal at your facility to not cause trauma, overheating, excessive cooling, behavioral stress, physical harm or unnecessary discomfort.

Identified during the February 23, 2022 inspection, a macaque sustained a left humerus fracture. The injury was identified and reported, and the animal was treated.

Date of Alleged Violation: September 23, 2022

9 C.F.R. § 2.33(b)(3) Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care This regulation allows for daily observations to be conducted by someone other than the attending veterinarian providing that timely and accurate information on problems of animal health, behavior, and well-being is conveyed to the attending veterinarian.

You failed to convey timely and accurate information as to the health of an animal to the attending veterinarian as stated in Veterinary Care Standard Operating Procedure (SOP).

Identified during the March 28, 2023 inspection, an animal care technician identified that a macaque was lethargic and dehydrated and immediately notified the Attending Veterinarian. The macaque was received treatment, but it was euthanized. A review of the records indicate that the macaque had loose/watery feces in the months of July, August, and September. The Veterinary Care SOP states that if loose stool is identified over the course of two days, the veterinarian should be notified. Loose or watery feces was noted in the macaque's medial record on July 17, 2022 and July 18, 2022, but

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there was no record of communicating this to the Attending Veterinarian.

The penalty for the alleged violation(s) described above is \$9,000.

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
