Dear Dr. Ramasubramanian,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your October 25, 2022 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of Virginia. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that two post-operative cages of mice had incomplete surgery cage cards on which the number of post-surgical observations had not been recorded. The mice were examined by a veterinarian and considered to be in good condition.

The corrective actions consisted of retraining the surgeons and research staff on post-operative observation frequency, documentation of analgesia administration, maintenance of surgery logs, and proper use of surgery cage cards. The laboratory revised the surgical training documents to address recordkeeping and standardized surgical terminology. The laboratory's surgical log was enhanced to accurately document post-operative care.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy and recommends a programmatic approach to enhancing post-operative recordkeeping.

# University of Virginia Animal Welfare Compliance Report PHS Assurance # A3245-01

The Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee found the following compliance issue while performing an assessment in the vivaria. Due to the timing of the discovery, investigation, and resolution, a preliminary report was not submitted. This document is a summary of the incident, actions taken, and final resolution.

UVA Compliance Case #: 2022-I

Nature of Incident(s):	Failure to adhere to approved protocol resulting in inadequate post- operative care; failure to maintain appropriate animal-related records. (mice)
Summary of Incident:	During an assessment in the vivaria, a member of the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) observed two cages with incomplete surgery cage cards. The cards were incomplete for the required number of post-operative observations. According to the veterinarian, the animals appeared to be okay at the time of the assessment.
Action taken by IACUC:	The IACUC discussed the incident at a convened meeting and determined that the incident was a significant deficiency because of the <i>potential</i> impact on animal welfare and the deviation from the IACUC policy. The Office of Animal Welfare (OAW) conducted a survival surgery seminar for research staff and one of the two surgeons was in attendance. The following were reviewed during the seminar: post-operative observation frequency based on surgery; documenting administration of analgesia, maintaining surgery logs, and proper use of surgery cage cards. The IACUC sent a letter to the PI notifying him of the deficiency and required a written corrective action plan to prevent reoccurrence.
Action taken by PI:	The PI responded to the IACUC concerns. In addition to the surgeon attending the specialized surgical seminar, the PI discussed the issue with the other surgeon in addition to all animal handlers in the laboratory. The PI retrained everyone regarding the number of post-operative observations required and the proper way to complete surgery cage cards. The surgical training documents used by the laboratory were enhanced to emphasize proper documentation and to standardize terminology used to describe surgical procedures. The laboratory also centralized and improved the surgery log being used to accurately document post-operative care.
Action taken by IACUC:	The IACUC felt that the PI responded appropriately and no further action was deemed necessary.
Decision/Resolution:	The IACUC accepted the corrective action plans as submitted by the PI and considered the incident resolved.
