### 2.40(b)(2) Direct

#### Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

An adult male Australian Shepherd dog (microchip 7E10207209) has severe dental disease. A heavy buildup of thick brown material was seen covering most of the teeth on both sides. The gums were bright red and swollen along the gumlines on both sides of the mouth. The front top incisors contained discharge near the base of the teeth with severe gum recession. Heavy buildup on the teeth with redness, swelling, recession, and discharge can be signs of dental problems and can cause infection, pain, and discomfort to the animal.

Failure to provide veterinary care when needed can result in prolonged suffering and worsening of the condition of the animal. Licensees must ensure that they establish and maintain programs of adequate veterinary care, including the use of appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases and injuries. When animals are identified with injuries or illness, they must seek care by their veterinarian to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases. Correct by ensuring that the animal listed above is examined and treated by a licensed veterinarian. The licensee must ensure that all animals receive adequate veterinary care at all times. Correct by 20-OCT-2023.

### Contingency planning.

The licensee does not have an adequate written contingency plan. The contingency plan did not address requirements including plans for all reasonably anticipated disasters or emergency scenarios. #### Housing facilities, general.

The surfaces in several primary enclosures are not being maintained:

-Seven enclosures housing a total of 5 adult dogs and 14 puppies have carpet with frayed edges. Frayed edges can be injurious to the regulated animal as they could ingest the material or it could cause entrapment.

-One enclosure contains surfaces that have excessive damage from scratching. The sides panels of one enclosure housing 2 adult dogs has excessive damage from scratching. Surfaces with excessive damage do not allow for proper sanitation.

All surfaces must be maintained on a regular basis. Surfaces of housing facilities—including houses, dens, and other furniture-type fixtures and objects within the facility—that cannot be readily cleaned and sanitized, must be replaced when worn or soiled. The carpets must be maintained without frayed edges and the side panels without excessive damage. Correct by 5-SEP-2023.

### 3.1(c)(3)

### Housing facilities, general.

Enclosures are not being cleaned properly. The walls and/or doors of 12 sheltered primary enclosures housing 21 adult dogs are soiled with brown and/or black material. Inadequate and infrequent cleaning and sanitization allows for the growth of disease-causing agents that may increase the risk of health hazards towards the animals. Appropriate cleaning and sanitization of the surfaces must include removal of the buildup of material found and to prevent accumulation of this material. All surfaces of housing facilities must be cleaned and sanitized when necessary to satisfy generally accepted husbandry standards and practices. Correct by ensuring hard surfaces with which the dogs come into contact with are spot cleaned daily and sanitized in accordance with 3.11 (b) of this sub part to prevent accumulation of excreta and reduce disease hazards. Correct by 5-SEP-2023.

### 3.13(a)(3)

#### Veterinary care for dogs.

The written Program of Veterinary Care (PVC) is not complete, parasite sampling is not being performed, and the PVC is not being followed:

-The Program of veterinary care is not complete. The PVC does not include sampling with a schedule for parasites and other pests (including fleas, worms, coccidia, giardia, and heartworm) and no sampling is being performed. Additionally, the vaccination schedule in the PVC does not include Rabies vaccines. Failure to perform parasite sampling with a schedule does not ensure the dogs are adequately protected from diseases and parasites and failure to have a complete PVC may not allow for the veterinarian's instructions to be adequately followed.

-Parvovirus vaccines are being given to puppies at 6 weeks of age while the PVC states to give the vaccine at 5 weeks of age. Failure to administer vaccines in accordance with a veterinary approved schedule can increase the risk of disease exposure and disease transmission, and cause illness to the animals.

The written program of veterinary care must address the requirements for adequate veterinary care and must include vaccinations for contagious and/or deadly diseases of dogs (including rabies, parvovirus, and distemper) and sampling and treatment of parasites and other pests (including fleas, worms, coccidia, giardia, and heartworm) in accordance with a schedule approved by the attending veterinarian. Correct by having the Attending Veterinarian update the written program of veterinary care with all the required information and ensure the instruction is followed. Correct by 26-SEP-2023.

### ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

Dog with microchip #0A01402443, female Yorkie, was noticed to have a heavy accumulation of dark brown crusty matter around her left eye. Licensee stated that his son had clipped the dog 2-3 days ago and he had nicked the skin by the eye. Upon further examination, the skin had been nicked or torn by the upper portion of the dogs eye lid. Licensee stated that his son applied a blood stopper agent at the time it happened. However; no further treatment has been given.

Having eye/skin issues can be painful and irritating to the dog if left untreated. Licensee must have methods to prevent, control, diagnose and treat all eye/skin issues. This dog must be seen by a licensed veterinarian. Documentation of the examination, diagnoses and treatment must maintained by the licensee and made available for inspection by APHIS officials.
