Dear Dr. Sui,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your July 9, 2024 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the Virginia Tech following up on an initial March 21, 2024 notification by telephone.

According to the information provided, this office understands that the Virginia Tech Animal Care and Use Committee (ACUC) determined that instances of noncompliance occurred with respect to failure to adhere to institutional policies/procedures. The final report states in February 2024, mice were transferred to a sealed, negative pressure IVC caging system. It is stated the following day, a number of mice were found dead or moribund and it was discovered the unit was not powered on. In response to the finding, the veterinarian was contacted, and the remaining animals were euthanized. Per the report, the incident occurred because an individual handling the transfer from standard IVC cages to the biocontainment rack, failed to perform a standard procedure to confirm power to the unit. It is understood the corrective actions involved an extensive plan for retraining the associated individual prior to restoring facility access authorization.

The report states the matter was discussed at the IACUC meeting in April 2024. The committee determined the incident was a serious noncompliance and the corrective measures implemented by the PI were approved. It is noted the animals are supported by PHS funding.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that the Virginia Tech has implemented appropriate measures to correct and prevent recurrences of these problems and is now compliant with provisions of the PHS Policy.

We appreciate being informed of these matters and find no cause for further action by this Office.

Final report regarding adverse event at Virginia Tech [Assurance #A-3208-01]

Dear Dr. Wolff:

Virginia Tech, in accordance with Assurance A-3208-01 and PHS Policy IV.F.3., provides this report of an adverse event involving mice on an IACUC approved protocol.

This incident was first reported to Teagan Ware, Animal Welfare Program Analyst. OLAW. on March 21, 2024 via a telephone call led by (b) (6)

During the call, Teagan provided A-3208-1S as the identifier for this report.

In February 2024, 23 mice were transferred from standard IVC cages to a sealed, negative pressure IVC caging system (biocontainment rack). The next day it was discovered that a number of mice were dead or moribound and that the unit was not powered on. The veterinarian was immediately contacted and the remaining mice were euthanized. It was determined that the individual handling the transfer had not performed a standard procedure to confirm power to the unit. Corrective actions by the PI included an extensive plan for retraining the associated individual before restoring facility access authorization.

After review and discussion at the convened April 2024 meeting, the IACUC determined that a serious non-compliance/animal welfare concern had occurred, and approved of the corrective actions implemented by the PI.

The funding source of these animals is via the NIH (Federal Award #: R21AI153919A). Per PHS requirement, the PI has been informed that they must cooperate with their grant administrator to determine if any funding related actions must be taken.

Virginia Tech is committed to protecting the welfare of animals used in research and appreciates the guidance and assistance provided by OLAW in this regard. Should you have any questions regarding this report, please contact (b) (6)


