Dear Dr. Sui,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your July 9, 2024 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, following up on an initial telephone report on May 3, 2024. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that several adult mice were subjected to tail snips for genotyping but failed to receive anesthesia/analgesia. The mice reportedly recovered uneventfully.

The corrective actions consisted of retraining the laboratory staff.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy and recommends that ongoing periodic post-approval monitoring is conducted to ensure that animal activities are carried out as described in the approved protocol. Thank you for keeping OLAW apprised on this matter.

Final report regarding adverse event at Virginia Tech [Assurance #A-3208-01]

Dear Dr. Wolff:

Virginia Tech, in accordance with Assurance A-3208-01 and PHS Policy IV.F.3., provides this report of an adverse event involving mice on an IACUC approved protocol.

This incident was first reported to Dr. Wolff on May 3, 2024 via a telephone call led by (b) (6) (b) (6)

After the call, Teagan provided

A-3208-1T as the identifier for this report.

In March 2024, several adult mice underwent tail tissue collection for genotyping purposes without the administration of anesthesia or analgesia described in the SOP approved under the IACUC protocol. All mice recovered from the procedure without complication. Corrective actions by the PI included retraining of laboratory members which was provided by Animal Resources and Care Division personnel.

The matter was reviewed by the IACUC at its next convened meeting, and the corrective actions implemented by the PI were approved.

The funding source of these animals is via the NIH (Federal Award #: R00AG070104). Per PHS requirement, the PI has been informed that they must cooperate with their grant administrator to determine if any funding related actions must be taken.


