#### Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

A six-year-old female Shiba Inu dog, identified #9221, is observed with right-hind limb lameness and two lacerations, five and six inches from the tail base, respectively. The dog is observed eating normally and navigating throughout its enclosure, but only intermittently places weight on the affected limb. The laceration closest to the tail base spans the width of the tail, measuring 1-inch wide and 0.5-inch long, and exposes deeper underlying tissue with adjacent dark skin; there is minimal discharge present. The other laceration, measuring 0.5-inch wide and 1-inch long, is a more superficial laceration that is similarly surrounded by dark skin but has no discharge present. A facility representative stated the lameness had been identified on Saturday, March 1, 2025, at which point the dog was immediately moved to separate housing for monitoring. The facility's written Program of Veterinary Care, however, does not provide guidance for monitoring or managing lameness nor wound care, nor was the veterinarian contacted for guidance.

As lameness of this nature is a sign of pain, and as open wounds may require thorough assessment and care, failure to seek care or establishing guidance for addressing these issues may result in unnecessarily prolonged pain or other medical risks. The facility must assure these injuries are addressed by a veterinarian and, going forward, must continue to maintain appropriate methods for diagnosing and treating medical problems. At the time of inspection, the facility representative notified the Attending Veterinarian and confirmed with the inspector that a plan for care of these injuries was arranged.

#### Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

A 5-year old female Shiba-Inu dog, identified #9220, is observed with non-weight bearing lameness of its left forelimb. The licensee reports that lameness has been slowly improving since first observed a few weeks ago, and the dog appears to intermittently place its foot to the ground more often than observed by the inspector at the previous inspection, but that veterinary care had not been sought until the morning of the current inspection. At that time, the phone was inoperable and the licensee was unable to make contact with a veterinarian. Despite mild improvement, lameness of the current nature is still a sign of significant pain and failure to seek care in a timely manner or establishing guidance to address these issues may result in unnecessarily prolonged pain. The facility must assure the dog is seen by a veterinarian and, going forward, must continue to maintain appropriate methods for diagnosing and treating medical problems.

#### Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

A 5-year old female Shiba-Inu dog, identified #9220, is observed with non-weight bearing lameness of its left forelimb. The dog is observed eating normally and navigating throughout its enclosure, but is unable to support weight on this limb throughout the inspection. A facility representative stated the problem had been previously identified by the facility and that it had improved during monitoring. The facility's written Program of Veterinary Care, however, does not provide guidance for monitoring or managing such issues. The inspector confirmed with a facility representative and with a call to the attending veterinarian that the veterinarian had not been notified. As lameness of this nature is a sign of significant pain, failure to seek care or establishing guidance for addressing these issues may result in unnecessarily prolonged pain. The facility must maintain appropriate methods of diagnosing and treating medical problems.

#### Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

A Goldendoodle id # 9256 has evident hair loss around her lower back and hips and the skin appears dry and flaky. The licensee has attributed hair loss to hormonal or seasonal allergies and has not communicated the skin condition of this dog to the AV. The hair loss and skin condition should be communicated to the AV in a timely manner so the veterinarian can determine next steps to diagnose and treat the animal.

#### Primary enclosures.

A section of metal panel under the shift door for one enclosure housing 4 dogs is rusted and in disrepair. This level of disrepair has created sharp rough edges which could be a hazard to the dogs. This panel must be repaired to keep the area structurally sound and safe for the dogs.

#### Veterinary care for dogs.

Currently the licensee is giving vaccines and parasite prevention according to his broker's schedule and not the schedule that is documented in his program of vet care and signed by the attending veterinarian. Additionally, the licensee has not followed his vet care plan for giving a second dosage of vaccines for puppies retained at the kennel past 12 weeks of age.

The license must follow the agreed upon vaccine and parasite control schedule to assure that the veterinarian has proper authority in all aspects of veterinary care.

#### Housing facilities, general.

A male Bichon Frise jumped over the wall in the outdoor run and was observed outside the kennel not in an enclosure.

The walls are approximately 5 feet high but the overhang that prevents dogs from jumping over had blown off in a windstorm a few days ago and not yet been repaired. The licensee replaced the dog into an outdoor run that had a temporary repair with a strip of material across the top to deter jumping.

Failure to provide housing that contains the animals can lead to animal escape, injury, and death.

Housing facilities for dogs must be kept in good repair, protect the animals from injury, and contain the animals securely.

#### Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

There was one dog observed with a health condition requiring treatment according to the Program of Veterinary Care or consultation with the attending veterinarian. Sparky, id# 9232, a male red Shiba Inu, DOB 7/31/19, had an abnormal right ear. The interior of the ear was red, irritated, and swollen with a moist brown discharge. The licensee had not observed the health condition, had not contacted the attending veterinarian, and was not administering any treatments. The Program of Veterinary Care on file addressed the condition and provided treatment options.

Swelling and redness with discharge in the ears may be indicative of infection and/or other veterinary medical conditions that can cause pain, discomfort, as well as damage to the ear.

The licensee must initiate treatment according to the Program of Veterinary Care or contact the attending veterinarian to determine a plan for diagnosis and treatment.

#### Handling of animals.

\*\*\* In an enclosure housing 4 Shiba Inu, one dog #9215 "Viola" had a fabric muzzle on because she was "picking on another dog." Although the muzzle allowed her to open her mouth to pant slightly, drink and eat, muzzles should not be left on dogs unattended. Viola, could cause physical harm to herself trying to remove it and it causes unnecessary discomfort for a prolonged period of time. This was corrected at the time of the inspection by removing the muzzle and moving her out of the enclosure to another safe space.

\*\*\* A Dachshund # 9224, "Dottie" housed with 4 other dogs had a bark collar around her neck. When she barked the collar let out a high pitched sound that negatively impacted her and likely the other dogs in the enclosures as it was also heard by the licensee and inspector. Having a bark collar on a kennel dog for an extended period of time can cause behavioral stress and cause unnecessary discomfort to the individual dog and others in the kennel as their hearing is highly sensitive. This collar was removed from the dog during the inspection.
