With Help from Whistleblowers, and YOU, PETA Exposes Cruelty on Factory Farms



Animals tormented for food are among the most abused in the world: crammed into filthy stalls and cages, forcibly manually impregnated, separated from their babies, and mutilated without pain relief—all before being killed. Much of this cruelty is legal and considered standard practice, and when a concerned worker witnesses something they know is wrong, they have few places to turn other than PETA.

Whistleblowers often contact PETA after being ignored by management and even government officials. When they do, we listen to them and do all that we can to help them expose—and end—the horrors they have witnessed.

Take the case of Pure Prairie Poultry, a chicken factory-farming and slaughter company that left thousands of chickens on trucks for five days without food or water and failed to provide food for more than 2 million chickens at its contract farms. After a whistleblower risked his career to alert PETA, authorities finally stepped in to feed the birds, and the company is now the subject of a criminal investigation (you can read more about him on page 3).

In the spring, another whistleblower turned to PETA to expose the alleged abuse of chickens at a Virginia slaughterhouse owned by Farmer Focus. “I’ve seen some

things that are not right,” the anonymous whistleblower told PETA, “but I have never witnessed anything like this before.”

The insider reported that, due to rough handling during transport, chickens’ wings and legs were bruised, broken, and dislocated at rates far beyond what the chicken industry considers “acceptable.” Chickens arrived at the slaughterhouse stressed, flapping, and struggling, and some even jumped off the conveyor belt in an attempt to escape. And a faulty electric “stunning bath” led to birds being decapitated while conscious or slowly drowned to death.


Farmer Focus claims to be transparent—yet the whistleblower said that the company consistently places incorrect farm ID labels on its “traceable” products.

Farmer Focus is also “animal-welfare certified” by the Global Animal Partnership (GAP), a sham certification scheme designed to mislead consumers with meaningless labels on meat, eggs, and dairy products.

PETA investigators have documented widespread cruelty and suffering at 12 GAP-certified facilities, including animals being kept in severely crowded conditions and workers beating, kicking, and throwing animals.

Yet so-called “animal protection” groups—including the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA), Compassion in World Farming, and Humane World for Animals—stand behind the organization. Some of their representatives are even sitting on its board of directors!

The “animal welfare” lies have to stop, and factory farms must be held accountable for their cruelty. PETA is grateful for the whistleblowers who risk their careers to expose abuse on factory farms.

Iowa Whistleblower Recognized as Champion for Chickens

When 38-year-old Iowa resident Jeremy Schmidt learned that some 2 million chickens were being left without food, he was determined to act—and he knew PETA could help.

An employee of chicken factory-farming and slaughter company Pure Prairie Poultry, Schmidt was alarmed when the company abruptly stopped providing feed for millions of chickens on its contract farms in October 2024. Not long after, Schmidt watched as Pure Prairie Poultry left thousands of chickens to languish on transport trucks without food or water for up to five days outside its now-shuttered slaughterhouse.

When the company failed to answer employees' questions about the starving animals, Schmidt risked his career to report the situation to PETA—the only organization available to industry whistleblowers who want to report cruelty concerns.

Thanks to Schmidt's actions and pressure from PETA, officials in Iowa and Minnesota intervened to feed the starving chickens. Federal officials then launched an investigation into Pure Prairie Poultry, and the company now faces bankruptcy—just two years after it collected more than \$45 million in subsidies.

In honor of Schmidt's courage, PETA awarded him the 2025 Nanci Alexander Activist Award. One of PETA's highest

honors, the award was named for Nanci Alexander, a Florida resident who was among the first to spark debate over SeaWorld's confinement of orcas and other marine animals and was behind Florida's ban on pig gestation crates.

Alexander was on hand in April to present the award at PETA's 45th anniversary celebration in Miami, which Schmidt attended with his wife.

"No living being should ever endure what those chickens did when Pure Prairie Poultry left them to starve to death, and I'm grateful that PETA was there to fight for them," Schmidt says. "I'm honored to be recognized by PETA and proud to have spoken up for those who couldn't advocate for themselves."

Vegan Red Velvet Chocolate Lava Cake

Ingredients

2 1/2 cups whole-wheat all-purpose flour
 1 1/2 cups organic sugar
 1 tsp. baking soda
 1 tsp. salt
 1 tsp. cocoa powder
 1 1/2 cups vegetable oil
 1 cup vegan milk mixed with 1 Tbsp. lemon juice
 2 Tbsp. ground flaxseed mixed with 6 Tbsp. water
 1/4 cup beet juice (from a can of beets)
 1 tsp. apple cider vinegar
 1 tsp. vanilla extract
 1 bar vegan dark chocolate baking squares
 Powdered sugar, for garnish

Instructions

1. Preheat the oven to 350°F.
2. Combine the flour, sugar, baking soda, salt, and cocoa powder in a large bowl. In a separate bowl, mix together the vegetable oil, vegan milk, flaxseed mixture, beet juice, apple cider vinegar, and vanilla extract. Pour the wet mixture into the dry mixture, stirring until smooth. Pour into a cake pan and insert the chocolate squares evenly throughout the batter.
3. Bake for 35 to 40 minutes. Let cool and use a strainer to decorate with powdered sugar.

Makes 12 servings.



Augustus was one of the 17 macaque "Silver Spring monkeys," most of whom were taken from their jungle homes in the late 1970s and purchased by animal experimenter Edward Taub for testing purposes. After PETA exposed the extreme cruelty and neglect that were being inflicted on Augustus and the others in Taub's laboratory at the Institute for Behavioral Research, the police raided it, and Taub became the first experimenter to be convicted of cruelty to animals.

While Augustus did not survive the experiments inflicted on him by Taub, he has inspired thousands of PETA members to leave a legacy for animals, helping create a future in which no animals will lose their freedom to cruel experiments.

Augustus' noble image and dignity make him a fitting symbol of the plight of all animals who have endured—and are still enduring—abuse at the hands of humans.
