2.32(a) Critical

Personnel qualifications.

Four piglets under IACUC approved protocol (PO300) were presented for necropsy. The necropsy report findings suggest regurgitation and aspiration as the cause of death for 3 of the 4 piglets. Veterinary observations determined that the research staff primarily responsible for carrying out procedures under study protocol PO300 were inadequately trained to work with the species to administer test material to piglets via oral gavage. Additionally, the IACUC noted that inexperienced staff were responsible for performing procedures and monitoring the piglets without direct supervision of the more experienced lab members as stated in the protocol. Inadequate staff training and study oversight can have a significant impact on the health and welfare of research animals.

Prior to the inspection, the PI had proposed and the IACUC approved a corrective action plan that included re-training, with veterinary oversight, of all research team members.

The research facility should ensure that all scientists, research technicians, and other personnel involved in animal care, treatment, and use are qualified to perform their duties. This responsibility shall be fulfilled in part through the provision of training and instruction to those personnel.

2.33(b)(3) Critical

Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care.

During the review of IACUC records, a reported incident involving the death of several piglets was found. On March 30, 2026, twenty-five piglets were born via cesarean section in accordance with an IACUC approved protocol (PO300). Within 1-2 days after the first procedure, six piglets died and five were humanely euthanized by the research staff. The laboratory records indicate that the piglets' health was deteriorating, however, the research staff continued to administer care on their own instead of contacting the veterinary staff. Failure to notify the veterinary staff in a timely manner when health concerns arise can result in pain, suffering, and/or death of the animals.

Research facilities shall establish and maintain programs of adequate veterinary care that include a mechanism of direct

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and frequent communication so that timely and accurate information on problems of animal health, behavior, and well-being are conveyed to the veterinarian.

Prior to the inspection, the PI had proposed and the IACUC approved a corrective action plan with additional intensive health monitoring, veterinary oversight, and specific study endpoints.
